RESOLUTION NO. 597

RESOLUTION ENACTING ORDINANCE NO. 35, AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE TUITION AND MISCELLANEOUS FEE STRUCTURE, SUBSIDIES, AND COLLECTION POLICIES OF THE CITY COLLEGE OF BAYAWAN, PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

“WHEREAS, Section 16, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all;

“WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers local government units to promote the general welfare and support educational programs and services for their constituents;

“WHEREAS, the City Government of Bayawan recognizes education as a vital instrument for social development, poverty reduction, human resource advancement, and economic growth;

“WHEREAS, the City College of Bayawan was established to provide affordable and accessible tertiary education to qualified students of the City of Bayawan and neighboring communities;

“WHEREAS, the City College of Bayawan requires a stable, transparent, and institutionalized tuition and miscellaneous fee structure to ensure the sustainability of its academic programs, improve educational services, and support institutional development;

“WHEREAS, the establishment of an appropriate tuition and miscellaneous fee structure is necessary to enable the City College of Bayawan to comply with the standards and requirements of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), including the requirements for Institutional Recognition;

“WHEREAS, compliance with CHED requirements is expected to facilitate the qualification of the City College of Bayawan for national government educational assistance programs, including the Unified Student Financial Assistance System for Tertiary Education (UniFAST), thereby increasing opportunities for students to receive tuition assistance and other educational benefits;

“WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed measure was conducted by the Sanggunian on June 26, 2026, at the City College of Bayawan, during which students, parents, stakeholders, school administrators, and concerned government officials were given the opportunity to express their views, comments, and recommendations on the proposed ordinance;



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“WHEREAS, during said public hearing, concerns were raised regarding tuition affordability, scholarship opportunities, installment payment arrangements, protection of currently enrolled students, and future access to UniFAST benefits, all of which were duly considered by the August Body;

“WHEREAS, the City Government of Bayawan remains committed to ensuring that no qualified Bayawanon student is deprived of educational opportunities by reason of financial limitations and shall continue to support scholarship, subsidy, and educational assistance programs consistent with existing laws and local ordinances;

“WHEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Mark Fidencio L. Aurelia and duly seconded by Honorable Councilor Portugaleza, Honorable Councilor Capulso, Honorable Councilor Santiago, Honorable Councilor Abrasaldo, Honorable Councilor Jamin, Honorable Councilor Sumalpong, Honorable Councilor Renacia, Honorable Councilor Saraña, Honorable Councilor Tizon, Honorable Cagas, LNMB President and Honorable Boltiador, SK Federated President, the Council

“RESOLVE, to enact, as it hereby enacts the following Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 35

AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE TUITION AND MISCELLANEOUS FEE STRUCTURE, SUBSIDIES, AND COLLECTION POLICIES OF THE CITY COLLEGE OF BAYAWAN, PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it ordained that:

SECTION 1: Short Title. - This ordinance shall be known as the City College of Bayawan Tuition and Miscellaneous Fee Structure.

SECTION 2: Declaration of Policy. - It shall be the declared policy of City Government of Bayawan to provide its constituents with access to quality, affordable and equitable education.

SECTION 3: Tuition, Miscellaneous and Other Fees. - There shall be a collection of Tuition, Miscellaneous and Other Fees. The Schedule of Fees is attached hereto as Annex "A" and Annex "B" and forms an integral parts of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Scholarship and Subsidy Program. - All scholarship and subsidies to bonafide student shall be subject to Ordinance No. 21 Series of 2024, otherwise known as the “Bayawan Expanded Education Scholarship Ordinance”.

Qualified students may avail themselves of scholarship grants, educational assistance, tuition subsidies, and other support programs under existing local ordinances, national laws, and policies of the City Government of Bayawan.

SECTION 5. Collection and Payment of Fees. - The City Treasurer, or his/her duly authorized representative, is hereby authorized to collect tuition and miscellaneous fees on behalf of the City College of Bayawan.

To promote accessibility and affordability, tuition and miscellaneous fees may be paid through installment arrangements and other payment schemes approved by the City Treasurer and the City College administration, subject to existing accounting, auditing, and government financial regulations.

All collections shall be properly receipted, accounted for, and deposited in the appropriate trust fund in accordance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 6. Tuition Fee of the Pioneering Batch. – Provision that the pioneering batch shall pay the tuition fee in effect at the time they enter the City College.



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SECTION 7. Payment of Tuition and Other School Fees. – Down payment is ₱3,000.00. The remaining amount will be split into two payments. The second installment must be settled at least one week prior to the midterm examination, and the final installment one week prior to the final examination.

SECTION 8. Utilization of Collections. – Funds collected under this Ordinance shall be utilized solely for purposes authorized by law and shall support the operations, development programs, educational services, facilities improvement, and other legitimate needs of the City College of Bayawan, subject to government accounting and auditing rules.

SECTION 9. Separability Clause. - If any provision of the ordinance is declared invalid, the remaining provision shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 10. Repealing Clause. - All ordinances, issuances, executive orders and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, amended and modified accordingly.

SECTION 11. Effectivity. - This ordinance shall take effect after compliance with the provision of R.A 7160, The LGC of 1991.
