RESOLUTION NO. 404

“WHEREAS, the City of Bayawan confers due recognition and Honor to Bayawanons for distinguished lifetime achievements that brought pride to its people and honor to the city by virtue of ordinance No. 15, S. 2000;

“WHEREAS, there is a need to amend said ordinance since Bayawan is already a city by virtue of R.A. 6656.

“WHEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Councilor Dael and jointly seconded by Honorable Barte and Honorable Councilor Francisco T. Diao, the Council.

“RESOLVED, To enact, as it hereby enacts, the following ordinance, to wit;

ORDINANCE NO. 24

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE NAME “HAMILING BAYAWANON AWARDS” AS A PROGRAM CONFERRING RECOGNITION TO BAYAWANONS BRINGING PRIDE AND HONOR TO BAYAWAN THROUGH DISTINGUISHED LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENTS AND PROVIDING RULES AND GUIDELINES RELATIVE THERETO, AND INSTITUTING THE AWARDS CEREMONY AS AN EVENT OF THE ANNUAL CHARTER DAY CELEBRATION.

Be it ordained that:

SECTION 1. There shall be a program that shall confer due recognition and honors to Bayawanons for distinguished lifetime achievements that brought pride to its people and honor to the city.

SECTION 2. The said program shall be known as the “Hamiling Bayawanon Awards, and the Awardee shall be called “Hamiling Bayawanon Awardee” for the year.

SECTION 3. The said program shall be conducted yearly, or as often as the local government of Bayawan may deem appropriate.

SECTION 4. The Hamiling Bayawanon Awards ceremonies shall be made an event of the annual charter day celebration.



SECTION 5. The following set of rules and guidelines shall govern the search and selection of the Hamiling Bayawanon Awardees of th4e year, viz:

5.1 Eligibility – Any person falling under any of the following interpretation:

- a. A person of Bayawanon parentage
- b. A person who is born and has resided for at least five (5) years in Bayawan
- c. A person who is married to a Bayawanon with continuous residency for a period of fifteen (15) years
- d. Any single person who has continuously resided in Bayawan for at least fifteen (15) years.

5.2 Coverage – The awards shall be conferred for outstanding achievement in any of the following fields:

- 5.2.1 Religion
- 5.2.2 Business and Entrepreneurship
- 5.2.3 Politics and Government
- 5.2.4 Education
- 5.2.5 Peace and Order
- 5.2.6 Medicine and Public Health
- 5.2.7 Social Services
- 5.2.8 Culture and the Arts
- 5.2.9 Science and Technology
- 5.2.10 Sports
- 5.2.11 And such other fields as may be deemed appropriate

5.3 Criteria – conferment of the Award for an outstanding achievement must consider ant of the following factors but not limited to:

- 5.3.1 Sphere of Influence
- 5.3.2 Impact on Sectors concerned
- 5.3.3 Recognition from peers
- 5.3.4 Significance of contributions to the field

5.4 Nomination and Endorsement – The candidate must be nominated by a Bayawanon or a duly registered non-government organization in the municipality, and endorsed by any registered religious, civic or non-government organization duly accredited by the local government of Bayawan, provided that all documents submitted shall become properties of the local government of Bayawan; provided further, that a standard/official nomination form and such other requirements shall be issued by the office of the City Mayor for the purpose.

5.5 Limitations – Only one award for each field shall be conferred each year; provided that no person who is already an awardee shall receive an award for another field in the same year, nor an awardee shall receive the same award in the future, provided further, that the local government of Bayawan shall not be obligated nor compelled to confer any award should it not find a deserving candidate.

5.6 Honors – conferred in a fitting ceremony, the Awardee shall receive:

- 5.6.1 Plaque of Recognition
- 5.6.2 Cash incentive to be determined on a yearly basis by the committee
- 5.6.3 Honors at the City Hall of Fame or Gallery of distinguished Bayawanons.

SECTION 6. There shall be a Hamiling Bayawanon Awards Committee, the members of which shall be appointed by the Municipal Mayor on a yearly basis, which shall; conduct the search, screening and selection of the Awardees in accordance with the rules and guidelines provided in Section 5 of this ordinance provided, that all the members of the said committee shall be disqualified to nominate or be a candidate.

SECTION 7. Conferment and holding of the Hamiling Bayawanonm Awards ceremonies shall be conducted by the Office of the City Mayor.


