RESOLUTION NO. 579

“WHEREAS, Section 458 (xi) of Republic Act No. 7160, the Local Government Code of 1991 provides: allows the City to give allowances and such other benefits to public elementary and high school teachers;

“WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 4670, the Magna Carta for Public School Teachers declared to be the policy of this Act to promote and improve the social and economic status of public school teachers, their living and working conditions, their terms of employment and career prospects in order that they may compare favorably with existing opportunities in other walks of life, attract and retain in the teaching profession more people with the proper qualifications, it being recognized that advance in education depends on the qualifications and ability of the teaching staff and that education is an essential factor in the economic growth of the nation as a productive investment of vital importance;

“WHEREAS, Resolution No. 159, City Ordinance No. 2, sponsored by Hon. Peter Paul Renacia, entitled “An Ordinance Providing for all the Allowances and such other benefits to the School Division Superintendent, Supervisors, Principals, Teachers and other Personnel for the Division of Bayawan City” was approved in 2013;

“WHEREAS, Department of Budget and Management Regional Office VII on its letter dated June 7, 2013 addressed to the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Bayawan City, clarified that for the purpose of granting honoraria, public school teachers shall mean teachers engaged in actual classroom teaching;

“WHEREAS, through the years, the Department of Education has augmented impressive array of benefits and cash allowances for DepEd Teachers;

“WHEREAS, the public and elementary and high school teachers deserve to receive incentives and such other benefits may it be from national budget or the local budget;

“WHEREAS, the City Government of Bayawan City, in the implementation of City Ordinance No. 2, Series of 2013, identifies points for improvement and sees the need to modify the said legislation;

“WHEREFORE, on the motion of Honorable Councilor Rusmar Ian D. Tijing and duly seconded by Honorable Councilor Merlita R. Gaudiel, the Council

“RESOLVED, to enact, as it hereby enacts the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 33

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING INCENTIVES FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS IN THE CITY OF BAYAWAN

Be it ordained that:

SECTION 1. TITLE

This ordinance shall be referred to as the "ORDINANCE PROVIDING INCENTIVES FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS IN THE CITY OF BAYAWAN".

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY

It is the declared policy of the City of Bayawan to recognize the role of education in the progress and development of the city. Being the prime partner of the Schools Division of Bayawan in providing quality education to the young people and the youth, the City Government of Bayawan shall promote the welfare of the public school teachers in order to equip them with the necessary tools and resources in providing efficient and effective teaching methods.

SECTION 3. COVERAGE

This ordinance shall cover all elementary and secondary public teachers in any of the public elementary schools, secondary schools and learning centers under the Schools Division of Bayawan who meet all of the following criteria:

- a) Teachers actually assigned in Bayawan City with permanent/probational appointment.
- b) Have actual teaching assignment.
- c) Served at least 6 months prior to the 1st day of January of the budget year.
- d) At a minimum, with "Very Satisfactory" mark on their performance rating.

SECTION 4. AMOUNT OF INCENTIVE

Each elementary and secondary public teacher covered by this Ordinance shall receive a monthly allowance of three hundred pesos (P300.00) for ten months or P3,000.00 per year pro rated on their actual service.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATIONS

The City Government hereby appropriates the necessary budget for each year, subject to such yearly adjustments as may be necessary to cover the ordained allowance for all elementary and secondary public teachers covered by this ordinance in the City of Bayawan subject to the availability of funds.

SECTION 6. IMPLEMENTATION

The Schools Division Office of Bayawan through the Schools Division Superintendent shall submit yearly to the Local School Board the list and information of the elementary and secondary public school teachers covered by this ordinance and qualified for incentive. The Local Chief Executive shall endorse to the City Budget Office for the necessary appropriation and implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE

By virtue of the Ordinance, all existing ordinances which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby deemed repealed, amended and modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If any provisions of the ordinance is declared unconstitutional or illegal by a competent court, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other provision.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVITY


This Ordinance shall take effect in compliance with the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991.




