RESOLUTION NO. 593

“WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11469 or the Bayanihan to Heal As One Act in its declaration of policy states that: “The COVID-19 pandemic has greatly affected nations worldwide, including the Philippines, and has caused and is continuing to cause loss of lives and disruption to the economy. Thus, there is an urgent need to (a) mitigate, if not contain, the transmission of COVID-19; (b) immediately mobilize assistance in the provision of basic necessities to families and individuals affected by the imposition of Community Quarantine, especially indigents and their families; (c) undertake measures that will prevent the overburdening of the healthcare system; (d) immediately and amply provide healthcare, including medical tests and treatment, to COVID-19 patients, persons under investigation (PUIs), persons under monitoring (PUMs); (e) undertake a program for recovery and rehabilitation, including a social amelioration program and provision of safety nets to all affected sectors; (f) ensure that there is sufficient, adequate and readily available funding to undertake the foregoing; (g) partner with the private sector and other stakeholders to these measures and programs quickly and efficiently; and (h) promote and protect the collective interests of all Filipinos in these challenging times.” XXX;

“WHEREAS, DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2020-083 dated May 18, 2020 in order to mitigate if not contain the transmission of COVID-19 virus adopted a measure by limiting the number of passengers on vehicles in addition to the observance of social distancing;

“WHEREAS, the city of Bayawan enacted Ordinance No. 59 series of 2019 entitled “A New Regulation and Operation of Motorized Tricycles within the City of Bayawan, Negros Oriental” which imposes the approved fares within authorized tricycle routes;

“WHEREAS, the limited passenger policy affected financially the tricycle drivers and operators in view of the 50% passenger capacity which in effect reduces the income of the said tricycle drivers and operators to 50%;

“WHEREAS, paragraph (vi) Republic Act No. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 grants to local government units the power to regulate the operation of tricycles and to grant franchises for the operation thereof within the territorial jurisdiction of the city;

“WHEREAS, there is a need to adjust the approved tricycle rates during this time of emergency in order to make it responsive and fair to the tricycle drivers and operators who are providing the transportation needs in this time of emergency;

“WHEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Councilor Narciso N. Casipong duly seconded by Honorable Tristan Gold T. Torrillo, SK Federated President, the Council,

“RESOLVED, to enact, as it hereby enacts the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 34

AN ORDINANCE SUSPENDING THE IMPOSITION OF FARE RATES UNDER SECTION IX OF ORDINANCE NO. 59 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS “THE NEW REGULATION AND OPERATION OF MOTORIZED TRICYCLES WITHIN THE CITY OF BAYAWAN, NEGROS ORIENTAL,” IMPOSING IN LIEU THEREOF INTERIM FARE RATES UNTIL THE PRESIDENTIAL DECLARATION OF STATE OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY BROUGHT ABOUT BY THE COVID – 19 PANDEMIC IS LIFTED

Be it ordained that:

Section 1. Imposition of fare rates under Section IX is provisionally suspended and/or amended an in lieu thereof, the following fare rates shall be applied:
